Crop Notice & Other Plantings in the Town's Right Away

The Darien Town Board Supervisors wish to remind Town Residents that all town road rights-of-way are 66 feet wide. Any crops planted within this 66 foot span may be mowed as part of normal roadway maintenance.

Walworth County Sheriff's Department

In the month of March, the Walworth County Sheriff's Department responded to 287 calls in the Town of Darien. This would break down to 9.9 calls a day. Some of the calls include: EMS & fire calls, reckless driver, house checks, civil process, assist motorists, theft, weapons, emergency detention, warrant attempt, trespassing, open door/window, debris in roadway, fire-alarm, abandoned vehicles, speeding, protective custody, MVA-PD, dog at large, tree down, 911-open line, controlled burn checks, car in ditches, sign down, attempt to locate, unknown problem, disorderly conduct – person, meeting, drugs, animal miscellaneous, MVA-hit & run PD, disorderly conduct – fighting, mental, and 911 hang-up.

Are you planning to fill a swimming pool or water your lawn or garden this summer? If so, please visit Village Hall and pick up a deduct meter. Upon return of the meter, the Village will provide a credit for the water used from the sewer portion of the account. There is a \$10 service fee for the meter and a \$10 deposit that is credited back to the account when the meter is returned. Please call Village Hall with questions or to reserve a meter.

Residential Swimming Pool Permit Information is available on our website and at the Village Hall. Residents are reminded that a permit is required for above-ground swimming pools with a depth of more than two feet and for the installation of in-ground swimming pools.

Roadside pickup of tree and shrub trimmings will be provided on **Tuesdays** through October. All material collected is chipped and recycled as wood chips or mulch. To keep program costs down and prevent damage to equipment, please follow the collection rules:

- Brush should be a minimum of 4 feet in length and no larger than 6 inches in diameter.
- Remove all roots, stumps and dirt and place brush on the shoulder of the road no farther than 4 feet from the edge of the road.
- Stack brush with cut ends facing the road edge.
- Keep materials away from trees, shrubs, utility poles, mailboxes and other obstructions.
- Do not stack in big piles.
- Do not put brush in bags, boxes or trash containers.

Materials Not Collected: Small twigs and branches less than 4 feet in length (these can be taken to the recycling/Compost Site at 339 Oak Street, Water Tower #1), material in boxes, bags or trash containers and material cleared from lots or undeveloped property.

The Compost Site is open weekdays 7:00 am to 3:30 pm and Saturdays 7:00 am to noon. Use is restricted to Village of Darien residents.
